### ◆ *Cast a Giant Shadow*

Mickey Marcus, the first General of the Armies of Israel in two thousand years, helps defend the country in the War of Independence.

### ◆ *Exodus*

Based on the Leon Uris novel, this epic film portrays the odyssey of the steamer *Exodus* and events leading up to Israel's War of Independence.

### ◆ *Golda Meir*

A CBS News special report on the personal and professional history of the former Prime Minister of Israel.

### ◆ *Hill 24 Doesn't Answer*

The personal stories of three soldiers assigned to defend a strategic hill outside of Jerusalem during Israel's War of Independence.

### ◆ *House on Chelouche Street*

A Sephardic family in Tel Aviv during the turbulent period at the end of the British Mandate.

### ◆ *How Israel Won the War*

A review of the military strategies that enabled Israel to defeat the Arab armies in the Six-Day War.

### ◆ *Operation Thunderbolt*

A reenactment of the dramatic rescue of the Air France flight that was hijacked and brought to Entebbe, Uganda.

### ◆ *Sadat in Israel*

Coverage of Egyptian President Anwar Sadat's historic visit to Jerusalem.

### ◆ *Sallah*

The hilarious satire of a hapless immigrant confronting Israeli bureaucracy.

### ◆ *See it Now: Egypt-Israel*

Edward R. Murrow interviews David Ben-Gurion and Gamel Abdel Nasser in this journey through the two countries before the Sinai campaign in 1956.

### ◆ *A Woman Called Golda*

A drama starring Ingrid Bergman that tells the story of Meir's life before she became Prime Minister of Israel.

### ◆ *The Wooden Gun*

Set in 1950, this film depicts the war games of two rival groups of children.
